This is a joint statement.

Madam President,

In eleven UN Member-States it is still possible to be punished by death, simply because of who you love. This is a flagrant violation of the fundamental right to life, as enshrined in the International Bill of Human Rights and reiterated by various UN treaty bodies, UNGA resolutions and by this very Council, most recently in its resolution 42/24.

We therefore welcome the report of the Secretary General on the Question of Death Penalty¹. The report touches upon this appalling situation and concludes that capital punishment must never be imposed because of consensual same-sex sexual acts between adults.

Madam President,

We welcome the findings of the report of the HRC Advisory Committee on National Policies and Human Rights, particularly its approach to the achievement of the 2030 Agenda². The report emphasizes that LGBTI people have been left behind and excluded from most national policies. Existing challenges are aggravated by the current COVID-19 pandemic. If States are truly committed to leaving no one behind, there is an urgent need to adopt national policies that combat violence, discrimination and stigma based on sexual orientation, gender identity and expression or sex characteristics and to include LGBTI persons and organizations that defend their rights since the creation, implementation and monitoring of the responses to the current and future crises.

Both aforementioned reports, as well as many others addressed to this Council, recognize that young people and LGBTI people are often victims of human rights violations. This highlights the urgent need to debate and address issues of LGBTI youth, to ensure their meaningful participation in different fora and to respect, protect and fulfil their human rights.
