ILGA World Conference Speaker and Session Scholars Statistics on Diversity as at 21 December 2018

ILGA will be paying for over 120 persons to attend the conference as scholars or session-presenters.

Regional Diversity

The 122 scholars come from 87 countries.

92 of the scholars come from low or middle-income countries¹.

31 are from Africa

29 are from Latin America and the Caribbean

27 are from Asia

19 are from Europe

11 are from Oceania

5 are from North America.

These regional splits are broadly in-line with the regional split of applications for scholarships.

Other Diversity

We currently have full data on 83 persons of the 120.

Indigenous or Traditional Identity (83)

37% (31 people) identify as coming from a traditional or ethnic group

Have a disability (83)

22% (19 people) say that have a disability or disabilities. We are working with each of them to identify what needs they may have.

Living with HIV (83)

19% (16 people) have declared that they are living with HIV.

Sex-worker

24% (20 people) have said that they are a sex worker

ILGA engagement

We currently have full data on 83 persons of the 120.

83% (69 people) have said this will be their first time at an ILGA World Conference.

80% (17 people) have never received an ILGA scholarship before.

63% say they are representing ILGA member organizations.
